Country Profile

Global Awareness in Health Care

- The United States of America (United States or U.S.) is a developed nation of 50 states in central North America between Mexico and Canada and various territories in the Pacific and Caribbean. [More...](#)

- The continental United States is bounded on the west by the Pacific Ocean and on the east by the Atlantic Ocean, with mountains, plains and desert areas in-between.
- People may live in large cities, suburbs (areas outside of cities), towns, or very rural areas.
- Religious and political freedoms are considered the right of every American and are mandated by law.

- A country of immigrants, America is a true melting pot of many cultures. [More...](#)

- Large cities have a very diverse mix of people, and small towns or rural areas are more homogenous (though may include people who immigrated from various cultures around the world).
- English is the primary language; Spanish is a prominent second language.

- With an advanced standard of living, U.S. citizens enjoy excellent general standards for health; much of their disease burden results from preventable and treatable conditions such as obesity, diabetes, and heart disease. [More...](#)

With routine immunizations, a non-tropical climate, clean water supplies, and a safe blood supply, infectious disease is not a widespread daily concern.

- People in the United States have easy access to high quality health care by highly trained providers. [More...](#)

Most people will find a health care provider within 25 miles (50 km) of home, if not closer. All medical and surgical specialties are available, as are sophisticated diagnostic and therapeutic options driven by the latest technologies.

- Much of U.S. health care is provided in the outpatient setting. [More...](#)

Patients have a procedure and are sent home as quickly as possible, then manage with home care nursing or services that do not require a hospital stay.

- Most people have a general practice physician who manages their care, and many must get a referral from this family practitioner to see a specialist. [More...](#)

Physician appointments and medical services are typically available by appointment during business hours (9am to 5pm, and some evenings and weekends); patients with urgent issues can

usually be seen the same day by a doctor or Advanced Nurse Practitioner.

- Patients may visit Urgent Care Centers for minor complaints, and, by federal law, they cannot be denied services at any hospital emergency department, even if they cannot pay.
- Doctors do not routinely make house calls.

- Medications are available at licensed pharmacies; a U.S. physician, Physician Assistant, or Advanced Nurse Practitioner must order all prescription medications. [More...](#)

- Medication costs vary greatly: There is a three-tier formulary system, with generic medications being the cheapest.
- People often must pay some part of their medication costs.
- People may purchase many medications for common conditions (headaches, allergies) from neighborhood stores without a prescription, at their own cost.

- Although access is available everywhere, Federal and State regulations, technology, and malpractice combine to make health care complicated and expensive. [More...](#)

- Complications come from:
 - Regulation by both Federal and State laws
 - Difficulties navigating overlapping programs and regulations
 - The addition of federal oversight to health insurance practices through the Affordable Care Act.
- Expenses result from:
 - Liability and malpractice issues (patients or companies pursuing lawsuits over poor outcomes)
 - Use of advanced technologies
 - The costs of developing drugs (highly regulated by law)
 - Excessive diagnostic testing by doctors or demanded by patients
 - Prescribing medications that may not be needed (but that patients demand).

- A world leader among developed nations, America has the world's largest national economy and a highly diverse population. [More...](#)

- Business progresses quickly compared to the pace in other countries.
- The work week is Monday to Friday; standard office hours are from 9am to 5pm but many professionals work more than that.
- Many women work outside the home and may occupy high-level managerial and executive positions.
